Just a quick point of process, the environmental assessment for this project is not being done by the Agency, it's being conducted by an independent panel. They closed their record in August, but you may wish to reach out to them with respect to your submission, their email is ceaa.panelrbt2-commissionrbt2.acee@canada.ca. Cindy Parker is the panel manager and you can reach her by phone at ^{<contact information removed>}. I cannot speak as to whether or not they would accept the submission for the purposes of the environmental assessment at this point.

Hello Mike and Dave, I hope you are both well! We have connected a little at Government of Canada events I've attended over the last few years and spoke a bit about the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 environmental assessment. We are nearing the end of the process and I would like to reach out to the S'ólh Téméxw Stewardship Alliance through yourselves again to see if you are interested in participating in the consultation process for the project? I would be happy to meet or set up a phone call to talk a little about the project with someone from People of the Rivers Referral Office, and we have funding available for any of the Nations working through People of the Rivers Referrals Office.

Please find attached two forms for People of the River to fill out to access funding for the RBT2 environmental assessment and consultation process. We have separated out the funding forms for the Nations PRRO works with as represented by Ts'elxwéyeqw (Chilliwack) Tribe Limited Partnership (form titled RBT2 TTLP) and those that are working directly with PRRO as part of the S'ólh Téméxw Stewardship Alliance (form titled RBT2 STSA). The total amount of funding available for all the 16 Nations you work with is \$15 893.

We would like to get the funds flowing to People of the River as soon as possible, so please get the completed application back to us by December 12, 2019.
