Re: Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project Environmental Assessment

I am writing on behalf of the Pacheedaht First Nation to advise that Pacheedaht First Nation supports and consents to the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority's proposed Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project, a marine container terminal which is subject to assessment for environmental effects by the provincial and federal governments, as it has been described to us now as well as any subsequent changes to the Project that are approved or required by any regulatory body or government (the "Project").

The people of Pacheedaht First Nation have lived in their Traditional Territory since time immemorial and have unextinguished Aboriginal rights, including title to lands, waters and resources in their Traditional Territory. Pacheedaht First Nation understands that the container ships travelling to and from the proposed marine terminal would travel through its Traditional Territory.

Pacheedaht First Nation acknowledges and agrees that it is satisfied with the mitigation measures provided by Vancouver Fraser Port Authority in respect of the environmental effects of the Project and associated marine shipping. We further agree that Pacheedaht First Nation has been adequately consulted and accommodated with respect to its Aboriginal rights, title and interests for the Project and associated marine shipping. Pacheedaht First Nation further consents to and supports the granting of each and every certificate, authorization and permit necessary for the Project and associated marine shipping.
