I am writing on behalf of the Tsawout First Nation ("Tsawout") to advise that Tsawout supports and consents to the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority's proposed Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project, a marine container terminal which is subject to assessment for environmental effects.

Tsawout understands that the location of the proposed marine terminal and the container ships travelling to and from the terminal are within our asserted traditional territory.

Tsawout acknowledges and agrees that it is satisfied with the mitigation measures provided by Vancouver Fraser Port Authority in respect of the environmental effects of the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project and associated marine shipping, agrees that there has been adequate consultation and accommodation of its Aboriginal and treaty rights, title and interests for the Project and associated marine shipping and further consents to and supports the granting of each and every certificate, authorization and permit necessary for the Project and associated marine shipping.
