Re: Woodfibre LNG – Public Comments Invited [February 9th to March 1st, 2016]

Please accept my comment on the analysis of the anticipated GHG emissions associated with the proposed Woodfibre Liquefied Natural Gas [LNG] Project in the Report named 'Woodfibre Liquefied Natural Gas [LNG] Project – Review of Related Upstream GHG Estimates'.

I oppose the partnership with Sukanto Tanoto in the Woodfibre LNG project.

If this panel is of the level of quality Canadians expect, the members must already be well aware of <offensive language removed> land clearing and burning activities, and countless human rights abuses should be at the forefront of your minds as this project is considered.

Having spent 22 years, from <personal information removed>, living and working in Southeast Asia, I feel my first-hand experience could help inform your decision.

Although based primarily in Kuala Lumpur and Singapore, virtually every year we, and the entire region, would be enveloped in smoke from land-clearing fires in Indonesia, for weeks, sometimes months. The disaster often making international news. With air pollution readings often over 300 PSI, my wife, infant son, friends and colleges, were forced to breath this toxic air, day in and day out. Imagine watching your child cough, cry, and suffer, and have nothing you can do about it. This horrible situation is made all

the more enraging when you become aware that <offensive language removed> to turn a blind eye. <offensive language removed> the worst offenders of these massive slash and burn operations. Therefore, I hold him personally responsible for the pain and suffering of my loved ones.

301–400 PSI: Hazardous; Early onset of certain diseases in addition to significant aggravation of symptoms in susceptible persons; and decreased exercise tolerance in healthy persons.

The panel should also know the level of corruption endemic to Indonesia. <offensive language removed>. Greenpeace USA considers <offensive language removed> the single worst destroyer of rain forest on the planet. There is no need for me to list <offensive language removed> individual crimes, the information is easily accessible.

It is beyond comprehension that the B.C. Government would consider Sukanto Tanoto a suitable partner for such a huge and important project. How can this decision be explained to the next generation? When there is money to be made, disregard everything you have been taught about morality and human values?

Beyond <offensive language removed>, I have great concern that we are introducing a person and organization, for whom <offensive language removed> are the normal methods for doing business, who have untold reserves of cash to buy people off, into our province, who's people have no experience with this level of corporate crime. I have lived and worked for 22 years in Southeast Asia, and people here have no concept of how things are done there. I fear it is inevitable that Canadians will be vulnerable to exploitation.

I urge the panel to reconsider any partnership involving Sukanto Tanoto. His past track record makes it abundantly clear, he <offensive language removed>. It is irresponsible to entrust British Columbia's environment and future to a such a monstrous character.
