Thank you for this opportunity to raise some of my concerns about the proposed Woodfibre LNG development.

It seems that this project does not align with the expressed wish of a majority of Canadians to move to keep GHG emission growth down below 2% and to move quickly towards even more significant emissions reductions.

It seems dangerous and ill conceived to subject the residents of this area and this ecosystem to the many harms and dangers of this development and operation for what seems like less reward than was first expected - in most areas of the proposed project's deliverable benefits to the community.

There will be a forecast 1 million additional tonnes of GHG emission each year of this facility's operation and it is simply not worth that kind of cost for this expensive and very unclean energy. Significant subsidy for this project looks like it will have little real positive effect in the community and the GHG emissions it will reliably generate will add significantly to the threat to this area by effects of climate change, as well as the limiting of our capacity to commit resources to other, greener projects. It is too much GHG cost for not enough benefit to the country or this community.

This project will be very harmful to our shared environment. It will produce some energy that is expensive to produce and dangerously high in GHG's. The environmental cost of this project is not justified and with the increasing amount and falling cost of far less costly energy from renewable and other sources - particularly in the markets intended for the products of this development: it behooves the ministry to act to prevent this development due to the environmental hazard it represents to Canadians. The GHG's it would produce are a significant harm and we stand to gain very little from bearing that harm.

This is a bad project. It will produce way too much GHG and will provide very little benefit to the community. To build it is to commit to a very costly process of poisoning ourselves.

Please use this opportunity to prevent the environmental degradation that this proposed development will perpetrate in this community and to our shared ecology.
