Dear Impact Assessment Agency of Canada and Minister Wilkinson:

On behalf of the Oakville Chamber of Commerce and our Board of Directors, we are writing to express our continued support for the approval and construction of the CN Milton Logistics Hub. The Oakville Chamber has written in support of this vital project previously and participated in the public hearing on the project in July 2019. We are pleased to have the opportunity to comment on the draft conditions.

The Oakville Chamber of Commerce is the voice of the Oakville business community, focused on fostering a healthy, engaged, and sustainable business environment. Like so many cities and towns across Canada, businesses in our community have faced unprecedented challenges due to the economic impact of COVID-19. The time is now to turn our attention to economic recovery and stability.
