I (David McIntyre) am submitting the following as a complement and supplement to previous Statements of Concern:

The attached pictures were taken May 2, 2020.

The Livingstone Range, hidden from view during a westward ascent of a paralleling ridge lying east of it, explodes into view within a few ridge-summitting footsteps. The pictured hikers, looking past blooming wildflowers, displaying grouse and snipe, are standing in the passing shadows of overhead eagles, hawks, and Sandhill cranes.
