Re: Cedar LNG Project – Proposed Amendments to the Decision Statement

Cedar LNG Partners LP, by its general partner Cedar LNG Partners (GP) Ltd. (Cedar), a Haisla Nation-led partnership with Pembina Pipeline Corporation, is constructing the Cedar LNG Project (the Project), a liquefied natural gas (LNG) export facility on Haisla-owned land in the traditional territory of Haisla Nation. Cedar commenced construction of the Project in July 2024.

On October 25, 2024, Cedar submitted an application to the BC Environmental Assessment Office and the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) to amend Environmental Assessment Certificate #23-01 and the *Impact Assessment Act* Decision Statement to enable an alternate transmission line route, the installation of a power distribution line, and an increase to the Marine Terminal Area.

Cedar has reviewed the proposed amendments to the Decision Statement posted to the Agency registry and respectfully requests that the Agency consider the following adjustments to the amended Decision Statement:

- In the Description of the Designated Project (page 5), the distribution line is described using both voltage and amperage. Cedar notes it is unusual to describe a power line using amperage and requests that the description be changed to read: “a distribution power line up to 2.8 kilometers long, and up to 25 kilovolts”.
- Cedar recognizes Condition 3.5.1 is subject to the parent clause (Condition 3.5) and therefore the in-water work window should only apply to pile driving. Cedar requests that this be clarified in the amended Decision Statement.

In addition, Cedar recognizes there was a comment regarding public use of the Bish Creek Forest Service Road (FSR) submitted to the Agency registry. Cedar notes the Bish Creek FSR is a public road managed by the provincial Ministry of Forests in accordance with the *Forest and Range Practices Act*. Although there may be short-term disruptions to traffic in accordance with applicable permits, Project activities are not anticipated to affect public use of the Bish Creek FSR.
