Dear Daniel Brown,

On behalf of the members of Sucker Creek First Nation (SCFN), I would like to inform you that we have now had the opportunity to consider the potential impacts of your proposed project passing through Sucker Creek First Nations asserted traditional territory.

The proposed project is only one of the many industry developments in our asserted traditional territory. Sucker Creek First Nation (SCFN) community and the Elders and Traditional Knowledge Holders in particular, have a responsibility to ensure that these developments, individually and collectively, do not adversely affect the ability of our future generations to exercise their Inherent Treaty and Aboriginal Rights.

In reviewing the proposed project, Sucker Creek First Nation (SCFN) identified the following general concerns:

- Traditional Land Uses- Which include: Hunting, Gathering, Fishing, Trapping and Ceremonial uses.
- Sacred site disturbance and disturbance of unknown burial sites;
- Migratory birds and listed species affected by noise;

- Rare plants affected by the quality;
- Fish and water quality affected by herbicides;
- Pre-contact artifacts uncovered during construction;
- Water quality affected by construction;
- Need for meaningful consultation on pre-disturbance assessments, environmental monitoring and adaptive management and health related research.

**Recommendations:**

Sucker Creek First Nation feels that many of its concerns can be dealt with on the basis of mutual respect and recognition and recommends the following:

1. Sucker Creek First Nation will provide a scope of work budget that will include: Work Order Submission Fee, Administration Fee, Site Assessment Fee, and all other agreed costs;

We would like to move forward on this project as soon as possible. We look forward to hearing from you soon.
