Potential Effects and Impacts

1. Please describe whether and how the potential adverse effects of the Project could result in changes to your community's:

The adverse affects of the proposed project will result in the deterioration and destruction of physical and cultural heritage sites of the LLRIB including ceremonial sites, cultural landscapes, and medicinal harvesting areas.

The adverse affects of the proposed project will result in the deterioration and destruction of lands and resources used for traditional purposes. Members of the LLRIB, currently utilize the lands identified in the project area for hunting fishing trapping and gathering.

The adverse affects of the proposed project will result in the deterioration and destruction of historically significant sites such as water bodies and tributaries of Lac La Ronge, muskegs used for traditional purposes, and ceremonial sites used by membership.
