It is highly recommended that the proponent consult the local ISET service delivery organization Kiikenomaga Kekenjigewen Employment and Training Services (KKETS), along with the surrounding ISET agreement holders. They will then be able to provide information on the labour force/potential employees, given they are largely aware of individuals who have already been trained or who could be trained to access these jobs.
