To whom it may concern,

I am writing to express my concern regarding the Nuclear Waste Management Organization's (NWMO) proposed deep geological repository for nuclear fuel waste, especially regarding the transportation of this waste to the proposed site.

Long-distance transportation of waste materials must be included in the review process. With consideration for the frequent occurrence of transport-related accidents along highways 11 and 17, I believe that the potential for environmental consequences and loss of life resulting from long-distance transportation must not be overlooked.

I would implore your team to carefully consider the potential environmental impact of a containment breach along the transit route. Much of Highway 17 runs directly alongside Lake Superior, our nation's greatest freshwater reservoir, at times from significant heights and with little margin for error. I am deeply concerned that the possibility of irreversible contamination of our drinking water has not been given sufficient care in the planning of this project.

Please integrate this feedback into your planning, and reconsider other sites with less probability of transit-related fatalities and potential environmental impact on freshwater reserves.
