These are my comments on the proposed Peace River Nuclear Project.

Our community was turned upside down for three and a half years by the last nuclear project. It caused a great deal of needless stress and friction among friends and families. Residents got rid of the project by voting 88% against it and delivered the message in person to the CNSC at a meeting in Manning. Two people in a crowd of 125 supported the project; the same number who believed the CNSC would look after us.

The community has not changed its mind about nuclear reactors especially when the proposed builder (SNC Lavalin) has been one of the most corrupt companies on Earth this century. Energy Alberta showed its lack of concern for residents by scheduling the comment period in the middle of spring planting when farm workers have no time to participate.

The construction period alone will change the character of the entire area. Communities are having trouble providing services to the current population base. How will they cope when 5000 construction workers and their baggage are added to the mix?

I don't want nuclear reactors built anywhere in the Peace River Area.
